TO BENEFIT VICTIMS AND THEIR FAMILIES, DIRECTLY, THROUGH ONE OF THE VICTIMS' COMPENSATION FUNDS WHICH HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED:

The Clark County Commission Chair Sisolak and Sheriff Tom Lombardo have established The Las Vegas Victims' Fund through Go Fund Me (<https://www.gofundme.com/dr2ks2-las-vegas-victims-fund>).

For those corporations, private foundations and others who can only distribute to a 501(c)3 public charity, Nevada Community Foundation (NCF) will establish a fund to serve as a temporary vehicle for charitable donations intended to provide relief and financial support for the victims and (their) families of the Las Vegas mass shooting. Checks may be made payable to **Nevada Community Foundation with the memo line to read "The Las Vegas Victims' Fund"**. **Nevada Community Foundation will NOT charge a fee for this service and all proceeds from our fund will be distributed to the Commission Chair's Fund as soon as it obtains its 501(c)3 public charity status.** Nevada Community Foundation has and will have neither authority nor influence over any aspect of the 501(c)3 public charity to be created by The Las Vegas Victims' Fund. Any questions as to its application process or criteria, policies or administration should be directed to Clark County. If for any reason, The Las Vegas Victims' Fund does not obtain 501 (c)3 public charity status, NCF will distribute any accumulated funds to other nonprofit organizations providing social services for the victims and their families of the Las Vegas mass shooting in Clark County.
